

"No need of sun and moon: the Lamb will be its lamp"

If you haven't heard, there is a rather unique event happening this month. On April 8th, there will be a total solar eclipse that will happen across our country. It has not happened since 2017 and it will not happen again until 2044. In Wisconsin, it will not be a total solar eclipse, but a partial one. Nevertheless, it is always fascinating to see this phenomenon.

Now most of us won't attach any special significance to this eclipse. It is just the natural movement of the earth and moon happening to align, as a total solar eclipse is the moon passing between the sun and the earth to create this unusual event.

However, in the Bible, the sun being blotted out or darkness coming upon a land was always a sign of God doing something important on earth.

The first instance in the Bible was God sending the ninth plague upon Egypt. It is where the Lord told Moses, "Stretch out your hand toward heaven, that there may be darkness over the land of Egypt, a darkness to be felt. So Moses stretched out his hand toward heaven, and there was pitch darkness in all the land of Egypt three days. They did not see one another, nor did anyone rise from his place for three days, but all the people of Israel had light where they lived."

Now obviously, no naturally occurring event could cause such a phenomenon in Egypt. If you study solar eclipses, they pass over a land rather quickly. It is estimated that this total solar eclipse will last around four minutes in most places. God caused a darkness to come over a part of Egypt for three days. It was of course to signal God's judgment on Egypt and their Pharaoh for rejecting His demand to let His people go and worship Him through Moses.

It was also to show that He alone was God, as the Egyptians worshipped the sun God Ra, as well as other deities related to this god, which they believed controlled various aspects of the sun rising and setting. They also believed in a sky goddess named Hathor, who supposedly was the goddess of love and joy. The Lord God was showing He alone should be worshipped and adored as the creator of the sun and moon. The Lord warns about worshipping the sun, moon, and stars in Deuteronomy 4:19 and 17:3.

We also see the Lord controlling the sun at the request of Joshua in Joshua 10:12-14. Joshua asks God to make the sun stand still so they could have victory over their enemies and the Lord grants it. It says the sun did not hurry to set for about a whole day (Joshua 10:13).

Job glorifies the Lord God in Job 9:7 for His control of the sun when he says, "who commands the sun, and it does not rise; who seals up the stars?" In the Psalms, it testifies to the Lord's control of the sun and the moon, such as Psalm 74:16, where it says, "Yours is the day, yours also the night; you have established the heavenly lights and the sun." In Psalm 148:3, it says, "Praise him, sun and moon, praise him, all you shining stars."

We also see this control in the Lord using the blotting out of the sun as a sign of judgment. In Isaiah 13:10, it says, **"For the stars of the heavens and their constellations will not give their light. The sun will be dark at its rising, and the moon will not shed its light."** They were the heavenly signs that were to accompany His judgment upon Babylon.

He also promises this as judgment over Egypt a second time. He says in Ezekiel 32:7, "When I blot you out, I will cover the heavens and make their stars dark; I will cover the sun with a cloud, and the moon shall not give its light."

In Amos 8:9, He promises this as a sign of judgment over Israel, when he says, "And on that day, I will make the sun go down at noon and darken the earth in broad daylight."

Of course, at Jesus' crucifixion, darkness came over the land for three hours until Jesus' death. Luke tells us it is because **"the sun's light failed."** It was signaling that Jesus was taking upon himself judgment for our sins. It is where the blotting out of the sun is usually a sign of God acting in judgment upon sin.

The final sign of this will be at Jesus' return on the last day. It says on that day in Matthew 24:29, "**the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light...**" It is because Jesus will come as the Judge of the living and the dead on that day.

Therefore, signs in the heavens are to be heeded. Now is there any divine significance to this eclipse? We have not been given a direct prophecy that it is so, but all these events in the heavens are to remind us that we are not long for this world. One day, our current sun and moon will cease to shine, as the Scriptures tell us, but it won't matter when we are believers in Jesus on that day because we will be raised to experience an eternal day.

Jesus tells us in Matthew 13:43, **"the righteous (that is the righteous in Him by faith) will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father."** It is referring to what we will receive as Christ's believing sheep on the last day in the resurrection. We will rise to receive the judgment of pardoned and forgiven from Jesus and we will shine in His kingdom forever.

In fact, Revelation tells us this, "And the city (the New Jerusalem) has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gives it light, and its lamp is the Lamb."

Our current sun and moon had the original purpose under God of marking seasons and days and years. It was also to govern the light that God had already created on the first day, but in the new heaven and earth, time will not need to be marked and light will not have to be governed because Jesus will be the light of that place and we will shine with Him in glory. As it says about the saints of Christ in the new heaven and new earth, "They will see his face and his name will be on their foreheads. And night will be no more. They will need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign forever and ever. (Revelation 22:4-5)."

Therefore, appreciate the sun and moon while we have them. Let them serve both as a testament to our Lord as creator, as well our reason to live in repentance and reverence towards Him always, but also may they point us to Christ and the glorious promise of salvation in Him. We have the promise of shining like the sun with Him through His forgiveness and grace, and what a glorious day it will be when the sun will cease to shine because Jesus will be our ever and constant light. Enjoy then the upcoming eclipse as a sign of things to come! Amen.

Senior luncheons will be held on the 3rd Wednesday of the month thru May 2024.


The schedule is as follows:

Lutherans For Life

April 7 – Easter II

How remarkable that our Lord's beloved Apostle St. John describes the Gospel of Jesus Christ as "the Word of Life" (1 John 1:2). He also declares all believers qualify as "little children" (2:1). And he proclaims that God has given His Son to redeem "the whole world" – every member of the human race, no matter what age, appearance, or ability. Even personal choice or political controversy can't keep us quiet about it!

April 14 – Easter III

With St. Peter and the Pentecost Apostles, we confess Jesus Christ alone as "Author of life" (Acts 3:15). This means no one else has right or responsibility to decide what kind of life a neighbor may have or when any human life ought to end. Rather, we rejoice to repeat the message of repentance and forgiveness (Luke 24:47) for every sinner and every sin – abortion and assisted suicide included.

April 21 – Easter IV

The Gracious Savior brings a delightful clarity to life-and-death issues and situations. Killing and destroying belongs entirely to the work of the devil (John 10:11). The people of God advocate and extend abundant, everlasting life to the Lord's every last little lamb. Unto all our neighbors, with both our voice and our goods (1 John 3:17), may we "come that they may have life and have it abundantly!"

April 28 – Easter V

It is anxiety and fright that drive folks to pursue abortion, physician-assisted suicide, and other measures that view death as a solution. Fear likewise bullies the sanctity of life into silence. But the Lord's perfect love puts all fear to flight (1 John 4:18). In surprise pregnancy and terminal diagnosis, we and our neighbors need not independence and empowerment but the presence, promises, and compassion of the Father Almighty.
