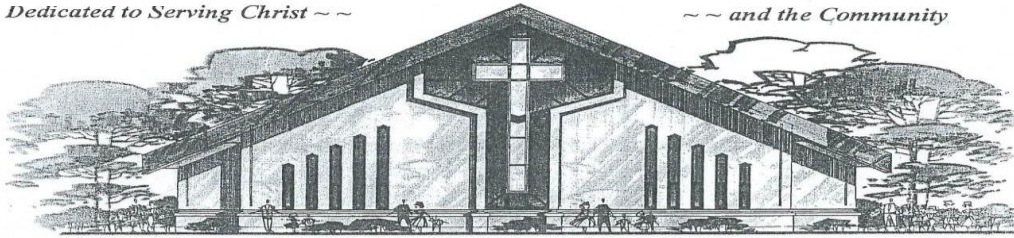

## “Now You Can Tell”

If you are unaware of it, I have been leading a Bible study through the miracles of Jesus since this Fall. For those of you who have not attended, we have often seen an interesting theme in Jesus’ miracles. He often tells the people He healed or people who witnessed the healing to remain silent about it. It would seem like an odd thing for Jesus to do.

When Jesus heals a man with leprosy in Mark 1, he tells him, **“See that you say nothing to anyone (1:44).”** It would seem the opposite of what you would expect Jesus to say. Why wouldn’t Jesus want those he healed to tell others about it?

We believe it is because Jesus wanted to control the spread of news about him and his popularity. He knew these people would still say something to others, but he didn’t want to direct them to do it to bring glory to himself for glory sake.

He does it again after he raises Jairus’ daughter from death where he strictly charged them to say nothing about it (Mark 5:43). Once again, Jesus didn’t want it spread to everyone that he could raise people from the dead because then everyone would mob him wanting a miracle and it would stand in the way of his movement toward the cross.

It is why Rev. Dr. Daniel Paavola, a professor of theology at Concordia University Wisconsin writes on this topic, “Jesus’ teaching and healing inevitably create crowds with varied motives. But He came not merely to feed the hungry each day, to do more miracles for miracle’s sake, or to be insulated from His enemies by adoring crowds. He needed space and time alone to teach the disciples, and He needed finally to be rejected by the crowds in order to reach the cross.”-Mark Commentary-p. 34

Jesus does the same thing after he heals a deaf man in Mark 7. It says, **“And Jesus charged them to tell no one. But the more he charged them, the more zealously they proclaimed it (7:36).”**

Therefore, it is clear that Jesus didn't want to be known or pursued as just a miracle worker. There would be time and place for the news of Jesus and His miracles to spread about Him, but he wanted it limited at first.

However, **NOW IS THAT TIME!** Now it is clear that Jesus wants these things known about Him. He says to his disciples, **“and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth (Acts 1:8).”** He says to them also, **“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you (Matthew 28:19-20).”** Jesus also said to them, **“When the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will bear witness about me. And you also will bear witness because you have been with me from the beginning (John 15:26-27).”**

Jesus promised His disciples that He would empower them through the “Helper” or Holy Spirit given by the Father to bear witness about Him. We too have been given that same Holy Spirit to empower us also for witness. We can share about the miracles of Jesus to others and make it known now. This is our calling as His church today.

Therefore, I hope that you might during this season of Lent take a moment to invite someone to one of our Lent services or to a weekend service or to our Easter worship. Invite them to “come and hear” or “come and see”, like Philip said to Nathanael in John 1. And when Nathanael did “come and see”, he was led to confess about Jesus, **“Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!”** Or when the disciples continued to encourage their friend Thomas after Jesus' resurrection saying “we have seen the Lord” and Thomas didn't believe them at first, they didn't give up and continued to invite Thomas to stay with them. Then, as he did, he got to see Jesus resurrected and said about Him, **“My Lord and my God.”**

We want people to “come and see” Jesus for themselves by inviting them to hear and learn about Him and it may be that in time the Holy Spirit will work in their lives to also confess along with you and Thomas about Jesus, “My Lord and my God.”

Therefore, now is not the time for secrets. Now is not the time to keep the deeds of Jesus hidden, but to share them in the hopes that others might see Jesus as their amazing miracle working Savior, just like we have “come to see.” Amen.



# Lutherans For Life

## **March 1 (Lent 2)**

Salvation comes only through faith in Christ, who was “lifted up” on the cross as the payment for the world’s sins (John 3:14-15). Not even Abraham our forefather was saved by his works or inner worth (Romans 4:2-3). In choosing to redeem us by His own grace apart from our works, God shows us that our value is not found in a person’s own qualities. Instead, every person is precious to God and worthy of dignity because “God so loved the world that He gave His only Son” (John 3:16).

## **March 8 (Lent 3)**

The world tells us to avoid suffering at all costs, even justifying murder (abortion, suicide, assisted suicide) on the grounds that death can be used to avoid further suffering. However, St. Paul reminds us that instead of trying to avoid suffering through death, we “can rejoice in our sufferings” (Romans 5:3), knowing that God uses our suffering to increase our hope in Him and bring us to everlasting glory. Therefore, when suffering comes, “let us kneel before the Lord, our Maker (Psalm 95:6), entrusting ourselves into the hands of the One who “died for us” (Romans 5:8).

## **March 15 (Lent 4)**

Sin makes us blind to the things of God (Isaiah 42:16, 18). Not only do we often fail to recognize our neighbors and the many needs they have, but we also have a hard time seeing our own lack of love (John 9:41) and need for salvation. Thankfully, Jesus has come to open our blind eyes and turn our darkness into light (John 9:6, Isaiah 42:16). The Lord not only grants us faith to see Him and know His salvation, He also empowers us to “walk as children of light” (Ephesians 5:8) to better see and serve our neighbors in need, from the least of them to the greatest.

## **March 22 (Lent 5)**

Jesus is the “resurrection and the life” (John 11:25), the one true God who raises the dead from their graves and gives them new life (Ezekiel 37:5-6). Everything Jesus has said and done testifies that He gives, sustains, and loves life. It is inconceivable to think that Jesus, who raised Lazarus from the tomb and who died to “give life to our mortal bodies” (Romans 8:11), would approve of the murder of any innocent person, regardless of their size or condition.

## **March 29 (Palm Sunday)**

When Pilate saw that he was gaining nothing, he gave up, washed his hands, called himself innocent, and let the Innocent One, our Lord Jesus Christ, be taken away and crucified (Matthew 27:24-26). As the world around us continues to call for the death of the innocent, it may seem that we are gaining nothing, and we will be tempted to wash our hands and give up like Pilate did. But the Lord, in His mercy, has given you a tongue to speak that you may sustain with His Word those who are weary (Isaiah 50:4). God grant us the strength to speak up on behalf of the innocent ones and let “every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father” (Philippians 2:11).
